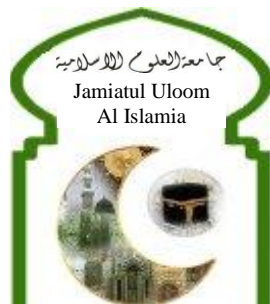

NEW GIFT AID SCHEME FROM 6th APRIL 2000

A recent change in the law means that, from now on, any donation you make to Jamiatul Uloom Al-Islamia could be worth more to us because, if you are a taxpayer, we can now reclaim the income tax you have paid on your gift/donation.

It does not cost you anything, and it's so easy too. All you need to do is to complete and sign the overleaf form.

Please note: We are able to claim up to a third of the value of all your donations whether large or small, regular/or one off provided you are a UK tax payer.

May Allah reward you for your support and co-operation.

NOTES:

1. Please notify Jamiatul Uloom Al-Islamia if you change your name or address while the declaration is still in force.
2. You must pay an amount of income tax and/or capital gains tax at least equal to the tax that the charity reclaims on your donations in the tax year (currently 28p for each £1 you give)
3. If in the future your circumstances change and you no longer pay tax on your income and capital gains equal to the tax the charity reclaims you should cancel your declaration (see note 4)
4. You can cancel the declaration at any time by notifying the charity in writing.
5. If you are unsure whether your donations qualify for Gift Aid relief ask the charity or you can ask your local tax office for leaflet IR 65 Gift Aid.
6. If you pay tax at the higher rate you can claim further relief in your Self Assessment tax return.
