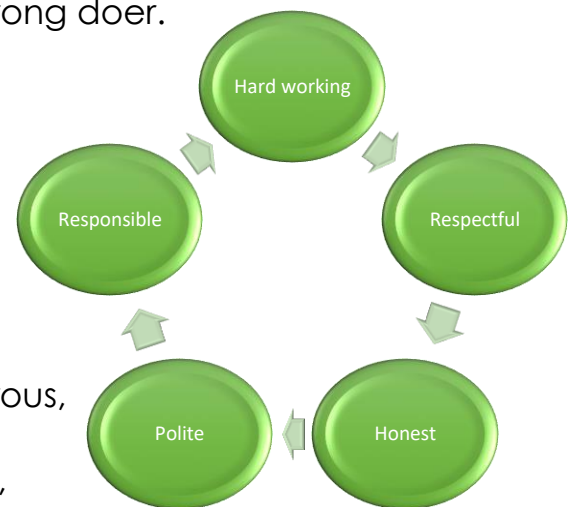

Code of Conduct

- High standards of attendance and punctuality should be maintained
- Success should be recognised, celebrated and valued by all
- Golden rule: hate the wrong, not the wrong doer.

School Rules

- Move sensibly around the school with humbleness
- Items that are considered to be dangerous, illegal and detrimental should not be brought into school, including weapons, drugs, vapes and other harmful substances
- Students must stay within permitted areas. Only through the permission of Jamiatul Uloom Al Islamia can they leave the school premises
- Electronic items, e.g. mp3s, games consoles, etc. should not be brought into school. Mobile phones must be handed in to the school office upon entering the school and will be returned at the end of the school day. Smartphones and smart watches are not permitted.
- If electronic items such as Mobile phones, lasers, mp3 players etc. are confiscated during the school day, these will only be return to a parent/guardian at the end of term (minimum of 30days). Some items may be disposed.
- Bringing in/using substances such as vapes, cigarettes or similar will lead to immediate suspension or permanent exclusions.
- Violent or racial behaviour of any kind will not be tolerated
- There should be respect for school property
- Chewing gum and fizzy drinks are strictly not permitted in the school premises. Fast food/junk food will not be allowed as packed lunch.
- Any form of disrespectful behaviour towards staff will not be tolerated
- Bullying of any sort will not be tolerated

MERITS / DOJO POINTS

Jamiatul Uloom will be offering up to 15-20 students with the highest number of points a rewards trip towards the end of the year. This trip will be only for our best students and is in addition to the whole school trips. We have taken our students to many different activities in the past, including Ice Skating, bowling, High Ropes, Indoor Skydiving and more. Each year will be a surprise trip!



AWARDS CEREMONY

Annual End of Year Ceremony will be held, where we celebrate and acknowledge the achievements and accomplishments of the students throughout the year. Categories include, highest test scores, highest attendance, highest punctuality, most improved student and student of the year, to name a few.

Failure to comply with the Code of Conduct or the School Rules will result in one or more of the following sanctions:

Break/After School Detentions

Students will be held for a set period by their respective teacher. For after school detentions longer than 10mins, a minimum of 24 hours' notice will be given. Teachers may contact you via phone, text or letter.

Conduct Report

If a student fails to improve in any of the concerns on the table below, parents/guardians will be notified and he will be placed on Conduct Report in order to monitor his development.

Punctuality Report

If a student is continuously late, parents/guardians will be notified and he will be placed on Punctuality Report in order to monitor his punctuality.

Temporary/Permanent Exclusion

If a student has been involved in a serious incident, or has not shown improvement in a particular issue, parents/guardians will be contacted to discuss the matter further. This may result in a temporary exclusion for a set number of days or, in an extremely severe case, a permanent exclusion.

CECEP – Curriculum Enhancement & Community Engagement Programme

Jamiatul Uloom Al Islamia firmly believes that school is not just about getting an education. Rather, it's a stage in a child's life where, if provided with an enriched, cultured and wholesome experience, he can go on to become an invaluable member of society.

Jamiatul Uloom Al Islamia aims to ensure that all students have as broad a curriculum as possible. As a faith school, we are fully conversant of the needs of our students and parents. Our students come from various cultural backgrounds and we want to ensure that these differences are embraced and unified. Jamiatul Uloom Al Islamia is very enthusiastic about educating students and developing them into young British Muslims.

We actively encourage students to experience a wide range of activities. These are imbedded in our curriculum, as well as in this Curriculum Enhancement & Community Engagement Programme (CECEP).

The CECEP comprises of many activities and events that both compliment the school curriculum and respective syllabi, as well as allow students to partake in extracurricular activities to empower them with life skills and enjoy real life experiences. Below is a brief outline of some of the activities you can partake in.

JAMIA STUDENT COUNCIL

The Jamia Student Council (JSC) is made up of 2 representatives from each year group who are nominated by their peers. The JSC will be the voice of the students. They will listen to and forward the views of the students as a body and discuss plans and procedures to enhance their experience at Jamiatul Uloom Al Islamia.

RSE CURRICULUM

As required by the DfE, Jamia cover Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) to all students. All content is appropriate for our children based on their Age, Physical and Emotional maturity, Religious and Cultural backgrounds and what students need to know to be healthy and safe in school, in their personal relationships and in the wider world. THEMED DAYS/WEEKS

Throughout the year, Jamiatul Uloom Al Islamia will hold themed weeks based on a topic of importance. These will include, National Anti-Bullying Week, National Interfaith Week, National Poetry Day, Hajj Week, Ramadhan Week, Health Awareness, Mental Health Week and more.

EDUCATIONAL WORKSHOPS

Jamiatul Uloom Al Islamia works with numerous organisations in order to deliver educative workshops of a wide nature. The workshops range from weapon crime to drug awareness, radicalisation to cultural cohesion. These will be delivered throughout the year for respective year groups.

EDUCATIONAL & CULTURAL OUTINGS

Jamiatul Uloom Al Islamia provides a range of educational outings. Certain visits will be subject orientated, while others will involve certain year groups. These visits include visits to London Dungeons, The London Science Museum, Luton Irish Forum, places of worship, Luton Fire Station, various field trips, workshops and much more.



RECREATIONAL OUTINGS

Our recreational outings include our annual end of year school trip, a merits trip and other fun outings for our students throughout the year.

CHARITY WORK

As Muslims, giving charity is an essential part of our life. Part of our multiagency, we have partnerships with The Luton Food Bank, Discover Islam and other organisations, where students partake in a range of charity events and activities.

Uniform

Our uniform policy is based on modesty and is based on the beloved Sunnah of Rasulullah (Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam). Students are to wear a white Jubbah/Thowb and a hat (topi).

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Students will not be permitted to wear caps, beanie hats or any other form of headgear within the school building. Clothing should be so tight that it reveals the figure; rather, it should be loose and comfortable. Pictures, images or large logos, i.e. people, animals, faces, slogans etc, are not permitted. Clothing must be always above the ankles. Students should ensure that their clothing is clean and presentable at all times. Please have spare sets of clothing available to avoid coming to school with incorrect uniform.

P.E KIT

Students will be involved in PE lessons every week, throughout the year. PE sessions will take place on grass fields and on concrete play areas. All students must bring PE clothing's listed below for every PE session. Students may wear these garments underneath their uniform, but must have spare pairs to change into.


HAIRCUTS

Google Classroom

All students should receive homework once every 2 weeks from all subjects. GCSE students may receive weekly homework to help with exam preparations. Homework will be mainly given using our online platform, Google Classroom. All students will be provided with login details when they start. Parent/guardian are requested to monitor online work and ensure these are being completed and returned every week.

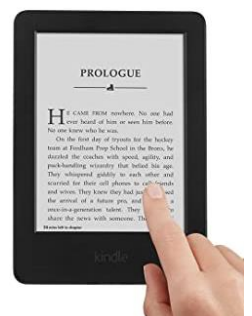
LOCKERS

All students will be provided with lockers in order to keep their school books & equipment secure. Students will need to pay a £10 deposit towards the lockers for the year. Once the key has been returned at the end of the academic year, a partial refund of £5 will be given back.

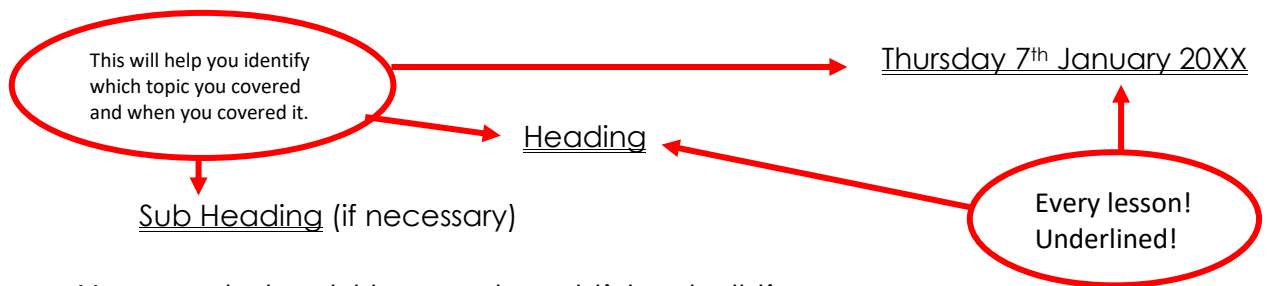
Please note: If locker key is lost or not returned end of year, then the full deposit may be withheld. Any damage caused to the lockers may be charged to parents. Students abusing the lockers or frequently losing their keys may have lockers taken away from them.


DIGITAL LIBRARY

Jamia uses Kindle devices to enhance our students' creativity skills and improve their vocabulary base. We have a large collection of digital books for educational and recreational reads. All books meet our curriculum needs.



Presentation of Work



- Your work should be neat and tidy at all times.
- Ensure your handwriting is neat and tidy. If you have issues regarding neat handwriting, spend your own time working on this.
- No graffiti.
- Cross out mistakes with ~~one~~ or ~~two~~ lines. Do not scribble  out work or cover it in ink so that the work is no longer visible.
- Keep your book clean. Do not spoil it with spills, stains, folds, rips & tares, missing pages/missing front covers, etc. If you want, you can invest in a protective cover for your exercise books.
- All drawings, tables, diagrams – basically, almost anything **non-written** – should be in pencil. If drawing anything with a straight line, use a ruler.
- Only write in **blue** or **black** ink. Never use **red** ink.
- No tipex / correction fluid.
- Some subjects may have additional and/or specific instructions in terms of presentation of work but **ALL SUBJECTS** will follow the above as a set procedure.
- It is good practice to write down the lesson objective for each lesson.

BREAK & LUNCH TIMES

Students should bring packed lunch to school. Our school dining area has heating facilities for you to warm up food. We strongly recommend a healthy diet and encourage you to avoid bringing in fast food and fizzy drinks. The school also has a tuck shop where you can purchase snacks and drinks. Please discuss allergies clearly before enrolment.

During break and lunch times, you will have your designated area of play and recreation throughout the week, which include the outdoor play area, the ICT suite, Patio area and The Games Room. During wet weather, students may not be permitted to go to the outdoor play area.

Students are not permitted to leave the school premises during lunch, unless authorised. Please inform the school of any medical conditions or allergies during enrolment.

ATTENDANCE

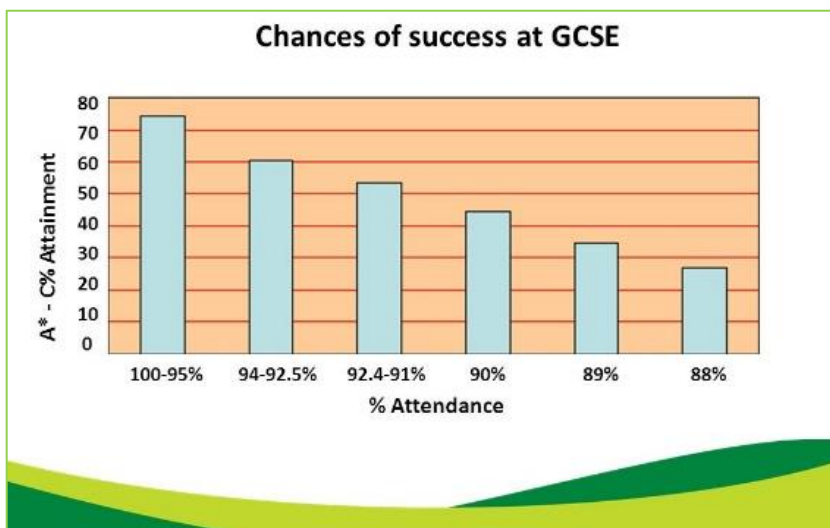
All pupils are expected to maintain a disciplined approach to attendance and punctuality. The school expects **95%** attendance and punctuality from every student in order to improve their chances of better grades. Students with the highest attendance & punctuality will be included in our end of year merits trip as a reward.

If you are absent, your parent/guardian must contact the school by 8:30am on the day of absence. This can be done by telephone or by sending a text message to the school mobile. If you are absence for 3 days or more, you must provide a doctor's note upon your return.

For scheduled appointments, you must provide the school office with an appointment card prior to your appointment date.

To request an emergency holiday, please write to the headteacher with full details of the emergency and the dates required.

Failure to comply with these procedures will result in "unauthorised absences" and fees will apply.



You are less likely to achieve good grades if your attendance is poor.

PUNCTUALITY

Students must attend school on time to avoid missing out on important lesson times. These lost minutes count towards how much time is lost in the year, which ultimately will affect your progression and exam grades.

It all adds up! Minutes late each day will mean many days lost each year.

Simple Fact: lost minutes = lost learning

If a student comes late, the number of minutes late will be recorded. When the number of minutes reaches 50 minutes in half a term, a fee of £20 will be charged (paid within 3 school days). Also, if you arrive late to school 3 times in a week, you will be issued a detention.
